1865

1. 5th June 1865. James Hume was attacked by a saltwater crocodile Lower Burdekin River near the bluff Old. Non-fatal.

A young man was attacked while bathing.

2. 20th January 1867. Young aboriginal girl killed by crocodile at Crocodile Creek Qld. FATAL.

An Alligator. At about noon on Sunday, the 20th, a young gin or piccaninny was bathing at the Crocodile Creek when she suddenly disappeared. The blackfellows from the camp close by the spot commenced howling and yabbering the noise! Was heard on board the Brig Craig Ellachie, which was lying at anchor off the ballast ground, about half-a-mile from the Railway Wharf and one of the seamen put off in a boat to ascertain the cause of the disturbance. The blacks told him that while the piccaninny, was bathing, she was snapped up by a large alligator, and carried off. One of the blacks further said that he saw another monster rise alongside the bank near the old slaughter yards.—

A Fearful Predicament.

A very startling adventure happened the other day to Mr Graham, of St. Helen's cattle station whilst crossing Alligator Creek, about four miles from his homestead in the Mackay district of New South Wales. He was riding at the time with Mr Royds. After going a short distance through the water, his companion, who was standing on the banks of the creek, saw an enormous crocodile rising out of the stream just in front of Mr Graham's horse, and at once called out to warn him. Mr Graham instantly raised his legs, but the huge animal reached high enough to take within its capacious jaws the right foot stirrup-iron, and part of the leg of the astonished horseman, who, as might easily be imagined, had to exert all the strength he possessed to prevent himself being dragged off his horse. Providentially, the stirrup became fixed in the mouth of the crocodile, and after some minutes of agonising desperation to get his imprisoned member free, Mr Graham had the satisfaction of seeing his formidable assailant release his hold and disappear in the water. Except some injuries to the leg, and the tearing of a leather gaiter, no other results have attended Mr Graham's narrow escape of being either crippled for life or be killed by the saurian.

"It released its intended victim and retired to the river. The victim was taken to Cairns Base Hospital with a frightfully lacerated thigh, but after six months' treatment under Dr Myers, left cured."

In the 1926 Special Jubilee supplement of The Cairns Post an article appeared under the heading:

What happened in 1884-85 — Cannibalistic natives

Word was received of the murder of Donald McAulay, a selector on the Mulgrave River. The body was found floating in the river, dreadfully mutilated, one arm and one leg being hacked from the body, and the head nearly severed from the trunk. It was thought from the mutilation that cannibalism had been practised. Comparing this description of the remains of Donald McAulay with that of the remains from several other crocodile attack victims, we could easily assume the local natives were possibly wrongly accused and thus — unjustly punished.

A FEARFUL DEATH!

On Tuesday evening last a terrible fate befell James Mason, aged 10 years. The father, Mr J E Mason of Stratford and his two bright healthy sons were bathing in the Barron River. They were in about 2 feet six of water. The sandy muddy spot was their favourite spot. They thought they were safe from crocs in the shallow water.

Suddenly came a splash. The mud was stirred up and the water lashed. The father's surprise turned to horror. He could not see his eldest boy, Jimmy. He threw the other child on the bank and dived where he had seen the splash. He found the boy and grasped his legs. Something more powerful was pulling the boy away. Then the father realised that a croc had taken his boy from his very side.

A few minutes later the croc rose to breathe in the middle of the river. In those fearful jaws was one leg of the unfortunate child.

Report by COMMANDER H. T. BENNETT D.S.O. RN.

During my five years' command of the surveying ship Geranium it was my good fortune to visit Napier Broome Bay on three occasions. Previous to my taking over the command the ship had been employed making a new survey of the bay and in 1920 during these operations had the misfortune to lose an officer, the gunner, Mr H Davies. This officer had landed during the week-end with the intention of shooting crocodiles. Failing to return by nightfall search parties were organised to scour the country, and the help of the monks was immediately sought and given. Nearly a week passed and there could be found not a trace. To make matters worse the ship while steaming along the coast of the bay struck a rock and was severely holed. This misfortune put all further search out of the question as far as the ship was concerned for Commander Lewis had a difficult proposition before him to save his ship. She had to leave immediately for docking and proceeded to Sydney. The monks then carried on with the search and three weeks later some natives found his mutilated body in long grass near the river. He had been attacked and killed by a crocodile, the Drysdale River being full of these reptiles. The body was buried by the monks in their little cemetery close to the mission station.

THREE men, named Longfield, Billy Nettle, and Billy Warren, were prospecting at Temple Bay, and had sunk a shaft near a creek where crocodiles were numerous. Warren went to Thursday Island for rations, and on his return his two mates had disappeared. All he ever found was a boot with a foot in it; all else had gone to the crocodiles.

53. 1921 CIRCA. An aboriginal woman killed by saltwater crocodiles Temple Bay Qld. FATAL.

Shortly after the deaths of Longfield and Billy Nettle, an aboriginal woman was killed on the same creek.

Some Pascoe blacks were camped near the same creek, and one of the women was cut in two by a crocodile, which took away one half and left the other. The men waited for him to come back, and they killed him with spears and ate him, their explanation being, when translated, "He ate our woman, and we eat him; that makes us square!" This big crocodile (C. porosus), which grows to a length of 25 feet, is numerous and very dangerous along all that east coast. I saw sixteen in a 14-mile trip down the Pascoe.

Just as it landed a crocodile snapped at it, making a grab with its claw, pulled the stirrup iron off and badly ripped the horse's side. With the wild plunge it made it tipped Andrews fair on the crocodile's back.' Both Andrews and the crocodile got a surprise, but he was able to get to the bank before the crocodile could seize him. The horse also made for the shore, but was again badly ripped before getting on dry land. It recovered under treatment.

BITTEN BY CROCODILE.

Attack in Shallow Water.

CAIRNS (Q). Jan. 25.—

While bathing with two companions in one of the esplanade enclosures about 10.45 o'clock last, night Kevin Conlon (24) was suddenly mauled by a crocodile. A large piece was bitten out of his hip and two deep seams and three or four smaller ones were made along his back. The fact that he was only about a dozen yards from the shore and the water was only about 18 inches deep was chiefly responsible for his escaping with his life. The three bathers immediately rushed for the shore, where Conlon collapsed. An ambulance was quickly on the scene.

It is understood that the wounds are not dangerous, but Conlon is also suffering from shock.

The Crocodiles Victim.

Inquiries made last night elicited the satisfactory information that Kevin Conlon, the victim of the crocodile attack on Thursday night, was doing well. He was comfortable after attention by the doctor and the hospital staff. Between 20 and 30 stitches had been inserted, but shock was almost as serious as his physical injuries. Dr. Langan said that the hip laceration was not so serious as at first was supposed; but the wound seemed to be the deep mark of a tooth, and the back injuries appeared to be from the slicing blow of the saurian's claw. Yesterday opinions were freely expressed that the attacker was a shark, but there remains little doubt that it was a crocodile.

HUGE ALLIGATOR.AT SCENE OF TRAGEDY.

SEARCH FOR CHILD CONTINUES.

INGHAM, January 8.

The search for the body of little Betty Doherty, who was taken by a monster alligator a few days ago, continues on the banks of the Seymour River, nine miles north of Ingham. To-day, when one of the search party arrived near the scene of the tragedy he saw a large saurian, 14ft long, on the fine sand of the river bank, just under the shade of the mangrove where the children were playing at the time of the tragedy. Evidently it was looking for further prey. Disturbed by the searcher, who was unarmed, it turned back to the water. After swimming about 10ft it turned its triangular nose towards the onlooker, and remained on the surface for a few minutes. For next Sunday a party has already been formed, including well known hunters, Messrs. G. N. Carr and A. A. Shaw, who intend to try to trap the saurian.

SNAPPING. CROCS. HORRORS' OF NORTH

Now in Sydney is Mr. JV Clarke, who, during a lifetime in the N.T. outback, has heard of many crocodile horrors, rivalling that on the Seymour River, near Ingham, on Monday when a reptile tore Betty Doherty, aged four, from her brother's arms. She was either eaten or buried in the river mud.

An indication of the strength of crocodiles was given a few years ago. Mr. A. Colton, of Gorgango Station, purchased several Suffolk Punch stallions. When they arrived from England they were turned out adjacent to Lake Iris, but a crocodile seized one of them by

the nose, dragged the stallion into the lake and drowned it. Mr. Cotton put about a pound of strychnine in various parts of the stallion's body and left it in the lake. A few days later, after it had been seen that the crocodile had had a meal off the body, the monster left the lake and made overland for the Proserpine River.

The tracks were followed, and about three-quarters of a mile across the plain the crocodile was found dead.—E.G.S.

CROCODILIAN SCARE

Three well-known residents of Mt. Larcom recently had an exciting encounter with a crocodile. Returning with a catch resulting from a successful day's fishing, they were attacked by a large crocodile near the mouth of Munduran Creek where that stream Empties into The Narrows, opposite Curtis Island (says the Rockhampton 'Bulletin'). After having failed to enter the small boat containing the men and the fish, the reptile tried to capsize the party, which attempt also was unsuccessful. At this juncture the fishermen decided that the shore would offer greater safety and a course was hurriedly steered towards land. To their surprise, the creature followed them through the water up to the landing point. The crisis was reached when the crocodile showed signs of a land attack. Tragedy was with little difficulty averted, however, and the incident was soon after regarded in the light of a comic touch "at the end of a perfect day."

FLASHBACK: The monster crocodile that killed two girls

IT'S hard to imagine the horror of a monster five metre crocodile attacking two schoolgirls as they rode across a creek on their way to school.

But in 1933, that's exactly what happened in the small rural Mackay community of Pindi Pindi.

As debate raged this week about whether a crocodile spotted off Eimeo Creek and Slade Point should be moved or culled, the historic account of the crocodile tragedy is chilling.

Sisters Mary and Thelma Adams left home to ride their horse to school on March 9, 1933 but they never arrived, the Daily Mercury reported at the time.

The girls, aged 10 and 6, had to cross Alligator Creek, a tributary of Blackrock Creek on their way to school and the horse's return home, wet and trembling, caused alarm and prompted an immediate search.

Thelma's body was soon found in the creek and at first it was thought the girls had been thrown from the horse after it had taken fright for some reason.

But Mary could not be found and a large search party was organised, led by Constable Gallagher, of Kolijo. By this time people believed something terrible had happened.

The girls' horse was brought to the scene and its nervous reaction led to the theory that a crocodile had lunged at it during the river crossing, the girls had been thrown off and Mary had been taken by the reptile. After days of fruitless searching, dead wallabies baited with strychnine were set in the creek.

On Friday, March 17 one of the carcasses had gone and the body of a 15-foot (five metre) crocodile was found floating about two miles away.

It was retrieved and cut open to reveal the remains of a child and clothing, which later was identified as that worn by Mary.

The incident horrified the people of the Mackay district and when another large reptile was sighted at Town Beach soon afterwards they were on high alert.

There had been numerous reports of attacks by large crocodiles since the start of European settlement in the region, and many had been shot, but the girls' deaths were the first attributed to a crocodile.

It was retrieved and cut open to reveal the remains of a child and clothing, which later was identified as that worn by Mary.

The incident horrified the people of the Mackay district and when another large reptile was sighted at Town Beach soon afterwards they were on high alert.

A Crocodile Tragedy.

A little later, I awoke with a start, senses alert, listening to the eerie bush sounds. Thoughts of crocodiles beset me. I conjured up the story we had heard at Wyndham of the German sailor who deserted his ship and wandered in land to seek .work:- One evening, camping by the Ord, he found the vicious mosquitos would not let him rest. In desperation, he clambered down to a shallow pool by the river, and lay in it with a handkerchief over his face. While asleep, a crocodile attacked him, and tore off a portion of his leg. He fought the crocodile back, and, managing to escape crawled to, and lay by, the road. Next day he was picked up by a stockman, but died from loss of blood before medical assistance could be procured.

Crocodile's Attack DARWIN, Monday.

Night Attack 100 Yds. From Darwin Railway Station

DARWIN. March 6.

A Malay member of the crew of a pearling lugger was badly mauled by a crocodile 100 yards from the Darwin railway station late on Friday night.]

He is in the Darwin Hospital in a serious condition. His right arm may have to be amputated. His thigh and leg were also mauled.

The seaman, who is from Koepang, is named Petreus. He was casting a net for fish in water up to his knees, when the crocodile seized him by the thigh, and attempted to drag him into deep water. He beat it off. and was staggering to the shore a few yards away when It returned to the attack and grabbed him by the right arm.

The victim's frenzied screams brought an aborigine running to his aid. He flung himself on the crocodile, which, scared by the noise, released his hold and disappeared. In the meantime, other Malays had reached the scene, and carried Petreus to safety. From the extent of. the teeth marks, it is estimated that the crocodile was about 12 ft. long. Two crocodiles, one nine and the other 10 feet long, have been caught in the vicinity within the past few weeks.

KOEPANGER'S NARROW ESCAPE

Another crocodile attack occurred near Gregory's pearling station on Monday night. , While washing clothes on the water's edge shortly after sundown, a Koepanger heard a sudden swish in the water near him. It is claimed he saw a crocodile. He jumped back just in time and rushed up towards the crews quarters, shrieking loudly: His companions raced down towards the water armed with sticks and searched for the saurian, but it had disappeared. It is believed this is the same one that attacked the Koepanger named Pedro last week, and for which efforts to capture it have so far been unsuccessful. On Tuesday night the same crocodile is believed to have been seen at Clark's pearling station in Frances Bay. Lugger crews living at the station attacked the monster with stones and lumps of iron. They had no gun and it escaped. Francis Bay, a favourite prawning spot, is now taboo

to most prawners, and until the saurian is captured they would; undoubtedly be courting danger to continue activities.

Just before the war, a station manager on a property, on Bradshaw's Creek, (off the Victoria River) was lying on the lawn, in front of the house, 50 yards above the river. Inside, his wife was resting under the nets. She heard a scream, and dashed out to see a huge 'gator, with her husband in its mouth, waddling down to the river. She followed, screaming and beating at its tail with a towel, which she had snatched up as she rushed from-the house. That was the last she saw of her husband.

This was also reported in a similar fashion by another newspaper.

More daring still was the crocodile who left the river and fifty yards away took the station manager of Bradshaw's Creek, who was lying on his lawn in front of his house. His wife heard him scream and looked out and saw him carried away never to be seen again.

87. THE ATTACKS ON ABORIGINAL PEOPLE ARE SIMPLY NOT RECORDED. Anecdotal.

It seems that, particularly in the case of the aborigines, numbers of crocodile attacks simply go unreported – "Amongst natives of the Daly and Alligator rivers you will meet many with stumps where arms once were." Lacking utensils for holding water, natives dip their hands into the rivers, and many an arm has been lost this way.

"How do you get away from an alligator?" Mr. Clarke was asked.

"Run' said Mr. Clarke. "No good firing a rifle at him- he'll ignore your shots, and get you. ; "Still, he's a coward, and if you can beat a kerosene tin at him, he'll probably turn tail. But if he once chasing you, run like blazes and climb the first tree.

"Don't change your course-if you swing on one side, he'll swing his tail round and get you. There's a river crossing at Bradshaw's, leading to the station, where the man was killed, and an old alligator has patrolled it for 10 years. No one dare cross without first bombing the water with dynamite or else getting a mob of natives to shout and beat the water with sticks."

88.17th March 1939. Maude killed by crocodile South Alligator River N.T. FATAL.

An aboriginal woman Maude, the wife of Bamboo Charlie, who was Tom Cole's best crocodile hunter, was taken by a saltwater crocodile while crossing the river. She was camped with Tom Cole, her husband, and other aboriginal people at Tom Cole's camp Ingarabba, which was at that time located on what is today the site of the current Ranger Station. Maude was swimming across the river, just where the concrete bridge is now, when the crocodile came up from behind. They shot the crocodile and found Maude's bones inside the dead crocodile.

Crocodile Attack re-unites victim with Family

Now rapidly recovering from the effects of having been shockingly mauled by crocodile at Saltwater Head, near Mossman, last month, Amos Maker, 55-year-old cane cutter, is happy in the knowledge that through the accident he has found his family again.

Baker became separated from his two daughters 10 years ago, when they were small children. Neither they nor he knew of each other's whereabouts until Miss C. M. Baker, of Bundaberg, read of the accident, immediately communicated with the Mossman hospital, and found it was her father who had been the victim of the attack. Baker is now sufficiently improved to tell the story of his experience.

"I was dragging a net at 9 p.m. when I heard my dogs barking excitedly," he said.

'Previously I had ordered them away, because dogs attract crocodiles, but they disobeyed me. One of the dogs leapt into the water and swam towards me. He seemed terrified. I took no notice, but shortly after noticed a black object swimming towards me. I thought it was one of the dogs until it was about five feet away. My blood froze as I realised it was the head of a crocodile.

'I was about eight yards from the shore at the time. In a flash it was on me. I managed to get a grip of its head with my left hand, and punched at it frantically with my right. The crocodile lashed out with one of its claws, and ripped down my chest.

'Although rapidly weakening from none loss of blood, I managed to gouge my thumb into one of its eyes. The crocodile turned suddenly and disappeared.

I stumbled out of the water, keeping to my feet only by the realisation that if I fell back it would come again.

'Police Sergeant Rinaldi and Mr. Goodrich must have heard me crying for help when they were fishing in mid-stream. Goodrich helped me for a quarter-mile to my hut, where the ambulance came to take me to hospital. I know I have been critically ill, and although I am feeling much better my sleep is made hideous by dreams of crocodiles'.

CROCODILE ATTACK

BRISBANE, Thursday: Frightfully mauled by a nine-foot crocodile, while pulling in a fishing net at Saltwater Head, near Mossman, Amos Baker, 55, canecutter, is now in Mossman Hospital in a critical condition. His right side and chest were severely lacerated, affecting his lungs, and his face and arms and the lower part of his body were lacerated and several ribs were fractured. Baker was 50 yards away from his mates when he was attacked.

92. 27th November 1942. Ellen Elizabeth Ah Kee killed by a saltwater crocodile Mulgrave River near Deral south of Cairns Qld .FATAL.

About 7pm on Friday, November 27, 1942, in the Mulgrave River at Deeral, some 30km south of Cairns, a tragic crocodile attack took place. Ellen Elizabeth Ah Kee, of Chinese-South-Sea Island extraction and only 12 years old, was gathering mussel shells in company of her sister Myra, 10, and her brother, Arthur, 9, as well as a close family relative, Georgina Olsworth, 35.

They were all in water less than a metre deep near the Deeral bridge. Ellen called out, "Oh Myra," and was gone in a swirl of water. The remaining members of the group immediately left the water. While looking back towards the river for Ellen they saw the top portion of her body come up out of the water — then disappear again. The commotion attracted the attention of Mr George Stroud who attempted to stalk and shoot the crocodile — it was soon too dark and the police were notified by telephone. The following morning George Stroud, Frank Giddins and Alex Lamperd started to search for the body. Three hundred metres from the attack site, at the mouth of a small creek, they found the trunk portion of a body. Twenty metres up this creek the spot was found where the body had been smashed up. Here they found a piece of human skull and some clothing caught in the overhead branches of trees — evidence of the method a crocodile uses when shaking its victim apart. A further 20 metres up this creek, a leg with some clothing attached was discovered. The crocodile was not sighted. The remains were later identified as those of Ellen Ah Kee. The postmortem certificate stated death was due to violent injuries which severed the neck and trunk.

While researching this case the conclusion was drawn that the crocodile responsible was possibly captured by the late Hughie Lewis, using a carbide bomb and bullock's heart. This capture would have occurred some time after the fatality, and no human remains were reported from the stomach contents of the animal. Ellen's surviving sister, Myra, stated the crocodile was never caught and "probably died of old age".

A point of interest — while researching newspapers, the paper of the day gave this attack report equal column space with Darwin being bombed by the Japanese. Both incidents were reported on the same page.

Serviceman saved from crocodile

A serviceman, in the north, risked his life to save a member of his unit from a terrible death.

^ The two men were fishing when a crocodile seized one by the leg and dragged him into the stream.

His companion immediately jumped into the water to his rescue.

Sig. G. Bourke tells of this dramatic incident in a letter to his sister at 330 Danks St., Middle Park, Melbourne.

THERE was a little excitement up here at the week-end. A fellow from a unit in the area was taken by a crocodile.

"Fortunately he was saved by a comrade, who jumped into the water after him and pulled him from the jaws of the croc. From what I can gather from the stories going round, the two were sitting on a log by the edge of a stream fishing and flashing a torch in the water.

As soon as they turned the torch off, the croc, grabbed the fellow by the upper part of the legs and pulled him into the water. Fortunately the water was shallow, or else the croc, would have had him under water in no time.

As soon as he saw what had happened the other chap immediately jumped into the water to help his stricken comrade. He grabbed him and hung on to him until the croc, let go.

By this time others had arrived at the scene, and they were able to frighten the croc away.

The croc only had his captive by the fleshy part of the legs. If he had got a grip on the bones there would have been little hope of retrieving him from the croc's powerful jaws.

The crocodile got away. They estimate that he was from ten to twelve feet long. The victim was unconscious for a day and a half in the hospital. He could not have his wounds stitched for nearly a week, as the bite of the crocodile is septic, and the wounds inflicted by it automatically become poisoned.

The fellow that went in and saved his mate did a very brave thing in my opinion. The croc could quite easily have taken him as well.

It is said that he has been recommended for a decoration. I don't know if this is right. He certainly deserves it. The same chap saved another fellow from drowning earlier in the year.

Whitelaw had failed to stop the crocodile with three shots from his revolver. The two men were shooting fish in about five feet of water. Whitelaw had hit a fish and had entered the water to retrieve it. As the crocodile approached, he hit it with two shots of the three in the magazine, and then threw the weapon at the reptile.

Carlile shot the crocodile from the bank with a service rifle. Whitelaw said: "I never before got out of the water so quickly. John had a free night on the beer on me."

Anderson said they thought the crocodile was a log in the swamp until it moved. Then the 10-foot monster rushed them. After fighting it, one of the crew started the motor of the car and he crocodile scurried back into the swamp. Creeks and swamps near Giru are infested with man-eating crocodiles. Drivers and cars are to-day facing the severest test so far on the tour--the 613-mile horror section from Townsville to Mt. Isa. First cars left Townsville at 7.12 a.m. and are scheduled to reach Mt. Isa at 2.14 a.m. tomorrow.

"He grabbed me near the shoulder and tried to pull me under the water", Batinarra told doctors. The crocodile had opened his jaws to make another bite when I poked my rifle as far down his throat as it would go".

It had made a series of plunges, coughed and spluttered and disappeared in the water with the rifle still in its throat.

Batinarra scrambled to the bank of the billabong where he collapsed from loss of blood.

His condition is satisfactory, but he is being detained as a precaution against complications.

The following report, which appeared in 'The Northern Territory News,' serves as reminder to persons travelling the Territory to beware of swimming in Territorial Waters.

Crocodiles mate at the beginning of the wet season near Darwin, and like any animals the female species are apt to attack if any persons get too close to their breeding grounds.

The report reads: 'I saw a dark shape and then it opened its mouth, I jumped up, screamed and ran.

Sergeant Ted Briggs, of the Darwin RAAF Base, said this describing an attack on him by a big crocodile at Tumbling Waters, 40 miles from the city recently.

At the time of the attack his four children were swimming in the lagoon, only 100 yards away.

'We had been down to Southport to visit the old Chinese ruins,' he said, 'we decided we would have a swim before returning to Darwin.' 'We went to the upper lagoon, and the children dived in to cool off.'

'I took my fishing line and strolled up the bank about 100 yards. 'I was sitting on the bank just past the water resources tower, when I saw a dark shape swimming fast towards me.

'It was making a beeline straight for me.' 'It opened its mouth and I realised it was a croc. I jumped up, screamed to my family and ran. 'Just before it reached the bank it turned back still with its mouth open.'

Sergeant Briggs, remembering the incident, said that he thought that jaw-to-jaw, the crocodile must have had a spread of 15 inches. 'The stomach was about three foot across, I reckon it was 15 foot long,' he added. Sergeant Briggs' wife Jane, was further up the bank with the four children all swimming in the lagoon. The four left the water when they heard their father scream.

Sergeant Briggs described the open mouth as 'some-thing like a grinning cat.'

Top End safari hunters believe the crocodile to be a female with a nest further down the bank.

A MATTER OF IDENTIFICATION - FATAL CROCODILE ATTACK-BORROLOOLA 7 SEPTEMBER 1986

Police throughout the world are often given the task of establishing the identity of persons who have died in suspicious or unusual circumstances'. The task in this matter was particularly difficult when the deceased person was killed and eaten by a huge crocodile. The story unravels as follows. At about 7pm on Saturday 6 September 1986 Lee McLeod (alias Rusty Wherret), a ringer who had been working in the Borroloola area, left the local hotel with a mate, Dennis Vowken. Both were in an intoxicated condition at the time. They proceeded to Rocky Point, some distance from the hotel, to a boat ramp on the McArthur River, behind the township. On arrival they consumed more alcohol, finally falling to sleep on the bank of the river. When Vowken awoke at about midnight he could not find McLeod in the immediate area, although McLeod's shirt was still there. Vowken felt no concern and left the area. Late on Sunday 7 September Vowken worried over McLeod's absence

and reported him missing to the Police. Borroloola lays 270km east of the Stuart Highway and is approximately 700km south east of Darwin. It is situated some 67 km inland from the sea and is located on the banks of the mighty McArthur River. The "Loo" as, it is affectionately known by locals, swelters in tropical heat, humidity and flies, being typical gulf cattle country. Even though isolated it is a fisherman's haven and also attracts a fair share of residents who revel in isolation, challenge and independence. The population of Borroloola at that time was about 100 Europeans and 200 Aboriginals. In addition to the barra, the river also plays host to a more sinister resident, the estuarine crocodile or "salties" as they are locally referred to. Legislation was introduced in 1972 to totally protect all crocodiles from hunting, allowing them to grow into exceptionally large animals and to move closer to inhabited areas than normally would have occurred in earlier times. After receiving the reported disappearance of McLeod, police conducted a cursory search of the area to no avail. Because McLeod's shirt was located on the bank of the river, police speculated that he may have gone for a swim, got into difficulties and drowned. A systematic search was conducted throughout Monday 8 September, and continued until police located severed human legs approximately 300 metres upstream from where McLeod and Vowken had slept, on Sunday 7th September. It was known that a large saltie in excess of 5 metres and known as "Gus" by the locals inhabited this portion of the river and was suspected as the culprit for the attack. At this stage police notified the Crocodile Task Force of the Conservation Commission, who arrived in Borroloola on Tuesday 9 September with a trap and their operational crocodile boat. They immediately set their trap and commenced night searches without success. At 2200 hours on Wednesday 10 September the Task Force systematically searched Gus' territory and noted a terrible stench, which they believed, came from the breath of a crocodile, consistent, they said, with a crocodile ingesting human remains. At 0030 hours on Thursday II September they located and harpooned Gus who towed their boat up and down the river until 0200 hours when they shot the crocodile as it charged the boat. The crocodile was towed to the boat ramp where the police met them. An autopsy was conducted immediately and police took possession of human remains. Gus was a huge crocodile who measured in at 4.87m even though the last II vertebrae were missing from his tail. Dr Graeme Webb, the Crocodile Expert, estimated that with his tail intact he would have measured approximately 5.05metres. Gus weighed just over a tonne and was estimated to be 60 years old. It is of note that approximately 5 months earlier an Aboriginal swimming across the river late at night with a carton of beer, was attacked by a crocodile, mouthed and "spat out", causing him to lose the carton. He was medivaced to Darwin for treatment. It is not possible to establish if Gus was the culprit in this matter The remains of McLeod were found headfirst in the stomach of Gus. The digestive juices of the crocodile had already reduced bone matter to the consistency of rubbery gristle, flesh to jelly-like substance and skin bleached and rubbery-like in texture. The remains were returned to Darwin for Post Mortem examination. The contents were examined in the Darwin Mortuary. Both arms were intact but as previously mentioned, the skin was reduced to a jelly-like consistency. There were no signs at all of papillary ridges but several pieces of epidermis had very clearly defined ridges, although some deterioration had taken place. As in all Coronial Inquests, positive identification of the deceased is of paramount importance. It would have been impossible

for anyone to visually identify McLeod after such a horrific death. It then became a responsibility of the police to satisfy the Coroner of the identity of the deceased person. Police had located some of McLeod's papers and established that he had previously been fingerprinted in Queensland. The task of identification was then handed over to the experts in the Fingerprint Bureau. A request .was made to their Queensland counterparts for a set of impressions. Sergeant 2/c Denzil McManus, Officer in Charge of the Bureau and Senior Constable David Prowse attended at the Mortuary, took possession of the epidermis and returned to the Fingerprint Bureau to commence the painstaking work. The skin appeared to be from the right and left thumb, left index finger and part of the left palm. The skin was thoroughly washed in warm water and dried very well before dusting with black powder, which was wiped off with methylated spirit, leaving a deposit of black powder between the ridges. This procedure itself took a considerable amount of time, as the experts were cognisant they may destroy the skin. The skin was then placed between two sheets of microscopic slide glass and photographed on Pan-X film with oblique lighting, then again with transmitted lighting. Both procedures were successful and police were able to use these photographs to match them against the fingerprints taken in Queensland. As a result they were able to positively identify the remains as that of Lee McLeod While DNA identification is now a new science which can be used to assist identification of deceased persons found in such circumstances, the work conducted by Northern Territory Police Fingerprints experts, Sergeant 2/c McManus and Senior Constable Prowse was acknowledged as exacting and expert work, given that the epidermis used in the procedure had almost been destroyed by the digestive system of the crocodile. It is also testament to the determination of the members involved in identifying the remains of Lee McLeod. The Coroner would have accepted that the remains were too putrefied to identify, but the dedication and professionalism of the members persevered until the successful result was obtained. Inspector MV Burke the Divisional Officer in charge of the Police Division, in his correspondence pertaining to the crocodile attack, summed up the matter succinctly. "It's a little sad when all the circumstances are viewed in retrospect. A chance meeting of man and beast resulted in a horrific, agonising exodus from this world by McLeod, and the tracking, harpooning, overpowering and final destruction of one of nature's relics of prehistoric times. A relic it might be, the oldest who maintained sovereignty over his particular "territory" for the last 15 odd years, ever since their kind were protected from being shot into extinction. This dominance only being maintained by fighting off allcomers until man, a creature from another element trespassed his domain, presenting himself as prey at a time when food was an apparent priority. There is no doubt had Gus fed in the days preceding his encounter with McLeod or, for that matter, had McLeod's reasoning not been clouded by alcohol, there would have been no cause for writing this account." Acknowledgment is also made to the Northern Territory Conservation Commission in accessing their file on the incident.

DARWIN: The Northern Territory Government is to let Aboriginal tribal elders decide the fate of a salt-water crocodile which killed a young man at a large billabong on the Cato River last weekend. The Minister for Conservation, Mr Manzie, said yesterday rangers from the NT Conservation Commission had been asked not to locate, trap or shoot the crocodile while Aboriginal leaders in the area met to consider what should be done.

Gumatj tribal elders were meeting at Dhalinbuy outstation, about 60km south-west of Nhulunbuy to decide the fate of the crocodile which took 25-year-old Mr Alex Stewart Burururu.

Crocodiles are sacred to the Gumatj and they are charged with ensuring their preservation.



DARWIN: A woman mauled by a 4m crocodile at the weekend was acting as a decoy to prevent an attack on her partly incapacitated husband. Lena Pangquee, 55, was in a serious but stable condition in Royal Darwin Hospital yesterday after being grabbed by the crocodile during a camping and fishing expedition to the Daly River floodplain, south of Darwin. Mrs Pangquee, her husband Peter, 55, and their son Peter, 35, had accompanied other members of the well-known Darwin family to an isolated creek near Woodykuppledere outstation, about 200km south of Darwin.

Peter, jr, said yesterday he forced the crocodile to retreat by poking his fingers into its eyes as it tried to drag his mother away. "It was something my father had told me to do if we were ever attacked," said Peter, jr, who had previously accompanied his father crocodile-hunting.

Peter, jr, said the crocodile attacked at about 11pm on Saturday as he, his parents and three teenage family members were asleep in a mosquito shelter.

"I was sleeping at my mother and father's feet when I heard my mother yell out," Peter, jr, said. "I jumped up and saw the crocodile rip straight through the mesh," he said.

"It came in from my parent's side and my mother could see it was going for dad. He's been left weak down one side after having a stroke and she just threw herself between him and the croc. "She was pulling him out of the way when the croc grabbed her around the body. I must have stuck my fingers about an inch into its eyes and it stopped as if it didn't know what to do. It dropped my mother and went up on to its hind legs before spinning around. "It hit a small tree near the tent and stopped for a minute and we wondered if it was going to attack again.

"I went and grabbed a shotgun from the car but by the time I loaded up it had gone back over the bank into the creek."

Peter, jr, said the family had believed they were safe from crocodile attack because of the steepness of the 2m bank beside their camp. A Royal Darwin Hospital spokeswoman said yesterday Mrs Pangquee remained in intensive care, but appeared to be recovering satisfactorily.

The chief wildlife ranger with the Northern Territory Conservation Commission, Ross Belcher, said it was the first report he had heard of a crocodile entering a tent.

A 15 year old girl was mauled by a croc in Chinaman Creek, close to the Cairns city centre last night. The girl was at a 'beer party' at a nearby camp. She went to the creek to swim when the 3m croc grabbed her leg. She was dragged underwater for several minutes. Then she caught hold of an overhead mangrove branch.

Two friends heard screams and raced to help. One young man climbed onto the branch and pulled her up by her hair. He passed her to the other man who had waded into the creek up to his chest. The croc still had the girl's legs in it's jaws. The man then had a `tug of war' with the croc as it tried to pull the girl under the water.

The other man yelled and splashed to distract the croc. The bleeding girl was finally hauled from the water. Police praised the men for their bravery. They said the attack highlighted the danger of swimming in or hanging around croc habitats. Foodscraps from the camp are believed to have attracted the croc to the area.

The men were fishing. Tony Franklin brought his boat into shallow water on a beach. It was dark and the water was pretty much gone by the time they settled the keel by rocking the boat.

They cooked a meal as the water level dropped. When the water dropped to a depth of 1.8m they hung a deep gill net from mangrove trees. They anchored the boat and 3 hours later picked up the fish and crabs.

By that time the water had well and truly receded and it was almost one km out to water. Bryan decided to go to the creek to wash the crabs and fish. The creek was a sandy creek similar to Rapid Creek Darwin, but only 1/3 of the size.

At dead low tide Bryan walked into the water with the basket. While Bryan was washing fish and crabs, young Paul Franklin was standing on a nearby bank about 3 or 4 feet higher.

Suddenly Paul yelled, "Get out of the water now!"

Bryan looked up and saw a bow wave coming toward him. He saw the glow of red eyes reflected in the torch. He dropped the basket and ran. He kept running until he got back to the boat. He then grabbed the 44 magnum and raced back to deal with the attacker.

The crocodile was long gone. It had enjoyed a feast of fish and crab. The basket remained, squashed flat, crushed by powerful jaws.

In 2005 a couple spent one hell of a night near the Pentecost River in the Kimberley. Below is what one of the victims told me about the attack. (Thanks, Sonia, for the first hand account!)

"The attack happened at 4am in the morning. He took one bite of the tent and then walked slowly backwards turning his head from left to right. The tent ripped opened and he took off with bedding from the tent. I flattened the car battery by hooking up a handheld spot light to the cigarette lighter and turning the ignition on full. The battery was flattened within minutes. We were stranded there for another two nights before we were rescued. My friend walked 12 kilometres and left a note on the Gibb River Road asking to be rescued."

Always camp well away from the water's edge.

The couple were camping alone along the Pentecost River, around 110 km west of Kununurra, in far northern West Australia, on Monday when they were woken by the attack at 3.30am (WST).

The pair, both locals in their 30s, told authorities the saltwater crocodile had their mozzie-dome mesh tent in its mouth.

"They saw that it was a very large crocodile ... acting quite aggressively towards them, trying to make a meal out of them,"

207. Ord River croc invasion into camp

Similarly a friend of mine had been camping at the lower Ord River near Kununurra. Thought he was doing the right thing by keeping all the fish scraps in a bucket. He woke up the next morning to find a crocodile had marched through the camp and helped itself to the scraps anyway.

Don't leave food scraps at your camp site.

He too had camped far too close to the water. It is unusual for a crocodile to leave the water at all, and certainly to move far away from it.

Stay well back and you will be safe.

Police save swimmer from crocodiles

A man swimming in crocodile-infested waters in the Northern Territory was saved from a likely grisly death when police arrived at the beach in the nick of time and began shooting into the water to scare the predators away.

Yesterday's drama, on an island beach at Alyangula on Groote Eylandt in the Gulf of Carpentaria, was captured on mobile phone camera by a frantic local man who quickly called police.

Constable Sean Stanley, 36, told smh.com.au that the 27-year-old swimmer did not heed his instructions to climb onto the crocodile trap, which was closer than the shore.

"He was so intoxicated he was just treading water trying to get his breath back," he said.

"The crocodile was about 20 metres behind him and then 10, it was making a beeline for him to attack him."

Constable Stanley said he initially fired one round in the direction of the crocodile.

"I'm not sure whether I hit it or just scraped but it was right on the money. The crocodile went under but it looked like it was still going in the direction of the swimmer and I fired another six rounds into the water where it had submerged."

Constable Stanley said there were plenty of "no swimming" signs along the beach warning that sharks, box jellyfish and crocodiles prowled the water.

He said it was very foolish to swim anywhere near the crocodile trap, which was intentionally baited with dead chickens or other carcasses to attract and capture ``problem crocodiles'' so they could be relocated to remote areas, but the swimmer was not grateful for the help when he got to shore.

"He was very intoxicated and started basically abusing police for the fact that we were shooting at crocodiles," Constable Stanley said.

"He stated that he had been living in the Territory for 27 years and he had swum with crocodiles before and knew crocodiles."

Mike O'Keefe, assistant manager at the beachside Alyangula Recreational Club, said he was shouting at the man to get out of the water while he was filming on his mobile phone.

"I was trying to explain to this idiot that a four-metre crocodile was going to kill him," Mr O'Keefe said.

The vision shows a man swimming close to a crocodile trap about 70 metres offshore with a much larger shape lurking nearby while constable Stanley fires his police issue Glock handgun into the water and another officer, Wayne Valla yells at him to get out of the water.

The swimmer's brother, not on the screen, is heard yelling at him to get out of the f--king water.

Mr O'Keefe said it was only when he examined the footage on his computer later that he noticed another shape, believed to be another crocodile, momentarily surfacing to the right of the picture.

He said the swimmer appeared to be very drunk and would have almost certainly been mauled if police hadn't arrived and began firing at a giant crocodile heading right for him, which scared it off.

"If you try to swim off this island you won't survive," Mr O'Keefe said.

He said fatal crocodile attacks had happened in the area before and one of the officers told him he had "pulled two dead bodies" from the infested waters, about 50km from the Northern Territory mainland, after attacks in the past.

"(The policeman) was not happy," Mr O'Keefe said. "(The swimmer) didn't have a clue what was going on, he was too pissed.

"Then after he swam to shore he argued with the coppers, saying 'What are you doing?'

"Police walked him to their vehicle and drove him to the police station just to find out the story because he was endangering his life, just to see if he had issues. I think they released him not long later.

"He was just on a bender on the alcohol and had probably been up all night."

Mr O'Keefe said he believed the swimmer was a contractor on the island for mining company Gemco but had heard he had since been fired.

"That's the thing about this place, if you stuff up in any major form you get thrown off the island," Mr O'Keefe said.

"Trying to commit suicide in this way would fit into that category."

Constable Stanley said the swimmer was fined \$110 for disorderly conduct.

The officer said he spoke to the swimmer about midday today at the Alyangula airport where he was taking a flight off the island just four weeks after he arrived because Gemco had fired him in the wake of the drunken incident.

"He seemed very hungover but he was very apologetic and thanked us for basically saving his life," Constable Stanley said.

Human remains were recovered Sunday in the hunt for a man snatched by a crocodile in front of terrified relatives on a boat trip in northern Australia.

The 62-year-old man was taken from his boat on the South Alligator River in Kakadu National Park late Saturday (June 7) afternoon as his wife, son and daughter-in-law looked on.

Police say the man was in Kakadu on a fishing trip with his wife, son and daughter-in-law at a remote waterhole on the South Alligator River system when he was taken by a 4.7m (15.3ft) crocodile on Saturday afternoon around 5pm.

Police have told media the man was in a boat and washing or emptying a bucket at the time of the attack.

The man's family heard splashing sounds and turned around but were not able to save him.

The victim's wife and daughter-in-law drove for two hours to the small town of Cooinda to raise the alarm.

There is no mobile phone network coverage in large areas of Kakadu National Park.

Wyndham attack: Crocodile that bit off woman's hand killed by rangers

A crocodile believed to have bitten off part of a woman's lower right arm, including her hand, in Western Australia's far north has been destroyed by authorities.

The woman, a local from Wyndham, <u>was attacked near a caravan park at the WA town</u>, and was flown to Darwin on Wednesday night.

She also suffered several puncture wounds to her left leg.

Authorities say the animal was lured with bait on a hand line late on Thursday afternoon.

Officers from the Department of Parks and Wildlife have since destroyed the animal.

The 68-year-old woman was attacked while walking at Three Mile Creek.

She has undergone surgery and is in a stable condition at Royal Darwin Hospital.

Parks and Wildlife district wildlife officer Peter Carstairs said the 2.2-metre-long crocodile needed to be destroyed.

"Because this crocodile attacked a person and was in an area used by people and pets, it was imperative that we removed it and we ensured that it was destroyed quickly and humanely," he said.

"Parks and Wildlife, the Balanggarra Rangers and the Shire of Wyndham East Kimberley staff will continue monitor the site over the coming days to ensure that there are no additional crocodiles in the area."

A father of five says his friend dragged him to safety by his shirt as a crocodile twice lunged at him at an east Kimberley waterway.

Mr Birch says he tripped when the crocodile lunged at him the first time.

"It got me on the side of my leg scratching me up," Mr Birch said.

"One of my mates grabbed me by the back of my shirt, lifted me out of the water.

"It had another go at me but I was up on the bank by then.

"I was in shock and I was in pain."

Elston Lami Lami recalls looking into the eye of a crocodile after accidently stepping on it during a family hunting trip on a remote island off Arnhem Land.

Key points:

- Elston Lami Lami stepped on a crocodile in a shallow creek, thinking it was a log
- The crocodile bit him on the leg and he had to be airlifted to hospital
- Relatives and his dogs distracted the croc, enabling his escape

"When he came up, when he flipped me and I looked at his eye, he had crocodile tears," Mr Lami Lami said.

"Like, you're mine, you're my lunch," the 42-year-old said from his bed at Royal Darwin Hospital.

Mr Lami Lami said the attack happened while he and three other men were walking alongside a billabong outside the community of Minjilang on Croker Island on Saturday.

He said they came across a creek with milky water dirty enough that they couldn't see the bottom.

As he tried to cross the creek, Mr Lami Lami stepped on what he thought was a log.

He said that when he stepped again he felt the body of a crocodile move and spin around "in a split second", throwing him back against the creek bank.

The father of five said all he could think about was his two daughters on the island.

"I hit him three times in the nose, he let me go," Mr Lami Lami said.

"[He] came back again, tried to attack me ... when he snapped at me, I grabbed him, held him at the jaw with two hands and I was getting weak.

"So I thought the only way to get his attention, I had to hit him again."

Mr Lami Lami said he dragged himself quickly back to the creek bank and when he got up noticed his leg was bleeding.

Family dog and relatives distracted croc

He said his relative was yelling at him in his local language "Run! Get up and run, run, run!"

"And I ran as fast as I can. I didn't care about the wound on my leg, the blood on my leg, all I thought about was my life."

Mr Lami Lami's injuries included a bite on the leg and another near his shorts, which he said the crocodile managed to shred.

He said the family dog and the yelling of his relatives distracted the crocodile and gave him a chance to run away.

In the aftermath, Mr Lami Lami said he felt numbness not pain but that he still had a half-hour walk back to the car.

"Whatever pain I was going through, I didn't want to show it to them boys, because I was the older one there," he said.

Mr Lami Lami said he was bandaged up back at the car and took a few paracetamol for his throbbing leg, before receiving treatment at the Minjilang Community Health Centre.

He was flown to Royal Darwin Hospital that day by CareFlight and must spend a few days there recovering before returning home.

A wildlife ranger who wrestled himself free from the jaws of a saltwater crocodile by poking it in the eyes, says he is grateful to be alive to tell the tale.

Key points:

- A 2.8 metre crocodile attacked Craig Dickmann in a remote area
- Mr Dickmann's right hand was 'degloved' and he had injuries to his other hand, arms and legs
- The Environment Department says the crocodile was humanely euthanased

Craig Dickmann, 54, recalled the horrifying moment he turned to pack up his fishing equipment at a remote beach on Queensland's Cape York Peninsula when a <u>2.8</u> metre crocodile lunged from the water and latched on to his thigh.

The incident happened at Captain Billy Landing on Sunday afternoon.

"It was quicker than your mind can register — that noise will haunt me forever I think, the snap of its jaws," Mr Dickmann said.

Mr Dickmann, who was off-duty at the time, then wrestled the crocodile and managed to free himself by jamming his thumb into the reptile's eye.

"[The crocodile was] rolling and if you can imagine, I am lying on the rocks on my back at this stage, trying to get away from it and it's virtually on top," he said.

"There is no weakness on this thing — it's a tank — my thoughts were 'I was going to try to push my thumb into its brain', so I pushed down as far as my thumb could go."

After Mr Dickmann freed himself, the crocodile lunged a second time and clamped onto his wrist, degloving his hand.

"I remember looking at [my hand] later on and saying 'that looks like when you peel back the flesh and do those diagrams on anatomy textbooks'," he said.

Mr Dickmann freed himself a second time by clamping the crocodile's jaws and "flicking" it into the water, where the reptile slid out of sight.

"I had a weird moment — because I was wearing crocs [shoes] at the time — and I thought 'I've got to go and get my crocs [shoes]'

"So I'm looking around in the water trying to fetch my crocs out of the water and I thought 'you idiot'."

Mr Dickmann then drove himself more than an hour back to the Heathlands Ranger Station where he works and phoned triple-0 and was given first aid by another ranger.

The closest airstrip where a Rural Flying Doctor Service (RFDS) plane could land safely at night was Bramwell Station, about an hour's drive south from the ranger station.

Mr Dickmann's colleague drove him to Bramwell Station to wait for the RFDS and he was then airlifted to Cairns Hospital about 8:00pm on Sunday.

'Very lucky man'

RFDS nurse Katie Corkill, who assisted with the rescue, said Mr Dickmann had shown incredible resilience.

"When we looked at his injuries and when we heard his story, we thought there are so many tiny details that could have gone completely differently," she said.

"He's a very lucky man. I am really happy for him — I think it's amazing and I am so glad he's come out of this and going to make a full recovery."

Now recovering in Cairns Hospital, Mr Dickmann said he was grateful to everyone who helped with the rescue.

"It's just one of those accidents that occurred — I was in the wrong place at the wrong time," he said.

"I checked the area for tracks, I made sure there was dry land behind me, I stood back from the edges — I think this croc was particularly cunning and particularly devious."

The Environment Department investigated the incident and said the crocodile was located on Tuesday night and humanely euthanased.



"He was grabbed from behind by a 1.8 metre [crocodile] and the man held onto some mangroves and the crocodile for some reason released him and swam away," she said.

A man in the Top End is counting his lucky stars after he was attacked by a crocodile while wading through a river in Arnhem Land.

Kelvin Guyula, 23, was fishing for worms in waist-deep water on the Glyde River south east of Ramingining about 5.30pm yesterday, when the 1.8 metre snapper latched onto him.

"The crocodile came up behind me and grabbed my legs," Mr Guyula told 9News.

"I was taking my belt off and I tied it around my leg," he said.

"I feel lucky, my bones is good and my muscles too," he said.

"I feel a little bit good, you know, the Panadol really helped keep me from this pain."

Mr Guyula'swife, Chelsea Gaykamangu said she was happy her husband would make a full recovery.

"He's got two big marks of teeth, and three of them it's just little teeth," Ms Gaykamangu said.

The 23-year-old was transported to Gove Hospital this afternoon for an additional check-up.

As for going out fishing for worms again, Mr Guyula says the ordeal hasn't scared him off.

Crocodile attack near Darwin leaves fishermen with serious hand injuries

A 24-year-old man has had surgery after being attacked by a crocodile across the harbour from Darwin last night.

Key points:

- The man was fishing at Mandorah, across the harbour from Darwin
- The man underwent surgery to reattach fingers and is in a stable condition
- The attack came a week after an attack in Arnhem Land left a man hospitalised but without serious injuries

The man had been fishing at Mandorah about 7:00pm when the incident occurred.

"We had reports of someone being bitten on the hand by a crocodile," St John Ambulance spokesman Craig Garraway said.

Mandorah is 5 kilometres west of Darwin by boat, but 120 kilometres by car.

Mr Garraway said paramedics met the man halfway between Mandorah and Royal Darwin Hospital after he was driven by others to Berry Springs.

"We met them at the Berry Springs shop area and a male there [had] quite serious injuries to a hand, where his fingers were quite severely damaged," he said.

"[He] required surgery last night at the Royal Darwin Hospital. So hopefully he's recovering well with all his fingers reattached."

Mr Garraway said he did not know any other details about the crocodile attack, including where it happened, under what circumstances or how large the crocodile was.

An NT Health Department spokesman said the man was in a stable condition after his operation.

Last week, a 23-year-old man in Arnhem Land escaped serious injury after he was <u>grabbed by a 1.8-metre crocodile</u> while fishing on the Glyde River near an outstation south-east of Ramingining.

The man held onto mangroves until the crocodile released him.

He suffered deep lacerations to his upper thigh and required hospitalisation at Nhulunbuy.

320. 24 Sept 2020, Man attacked by saltwater crocodile Lizard Island, NON-FATAL.

A crocodile bit a man on the head and neck as he was snorkelling off an island on Australia's Great Barrier Reef.

The 33-year-old was flown to hospital after Wednesday's attack by what is believed to be a two-metre (six-foot) saltwater crocodile near the Lizard Island resort, a Queensland state official said in a statement.

Wildlife officers will travel to Lizard Island to attempt to locate and remove the crocodile, the official said.

He warned the island was in known "croc country", and reminded people to be wary when swimming in the area.

Lizard Island in far north Queensland is surrounded by the Great Barrier Reef -- a popular tourist destination renowned for its diving and snorkelling.

The man was bitten on the face and also on the head.

"The man was driven to Broome Hospital on Friday evening after the incident which occurred while he was spear fishing in Pender Bay, a remote region on the Dampier Peninsula about 200km north of Broome.

A photograph of the man's injuries taken shortly after the attack shows cuts on the man's head and near his eye.

The man told 7NEWS that he is OK, but the attack was the scariest thing he had experienced in his life.

Saltwater crocodiles can grow up to 6m long and are common across the Kimberley, and are known to be most aggressive during the breeding season, which is September to May."

322. 28 JAN 2021 Mark Ridge attacked by 2.5m crocodile LAKE PLACID, Qld. NON-FATAL.

Lake Placid is a waterhole just off the Barron River, near Cairns. Mark Ridge was grabbed on the head by the crocodile but managed to prise its jaws off before swimming back to shore. He lived to show off his injuries, which includes lacerations on his arms, shoulder and neck as well as a "few holes" in his head.

There is some confusion about his age as News.com reports his age at 56-year-old, whereas 44 years old is indicated by Newsweek and the Cairns Post.

The attack occurred 11km northwest of Cairns' CBD at Lake Placid. He swam 400m to shore as the crocodile roamed.

He was transported to Cairns Hospital in a stable condition after sustaining multiple minor lacerations at 12.43pm. He was treated for lacerations.

323. 31 Jan 2021. Isaac Adidi (22 years old) attacked by 3.6m saltwater crocodile near Weipa Qld. NON FATAL.

Warning: Graphic content

Isaac Adidi suffered injuries to his hand after being attacked by the 3.6m reptile at Vyces Crossing near the Cape York Peninsula community Weipa. The 22 year old told media he managed to free his hand from the animal's jaws by eye-gouging it following the attack on January 31.

The saltwater crocodile has been killed by rangers. Parks and Wildlife officers found the crocodile about 50m upstream from the swimming hole where the attack happened. They had been planning to relocate the animal but it was in a poor condition, emaciated and missing several teeth, so they made the decision to euthanise it.

The man managed to pry the reptile's jaws off his head and neck before swimming to shore.

That reptile was taken to an approved crocodile farm after it was caught by rangers.

HUMAN REMAINS FOUND. Friends of Andrew Heard, 69, say he was 'a fine man' after remains were found in the search for the fisherman believed to be killed by a crocodile.

The upturned and damaged dinghy used by the fisherman was located with human remains found in the vicinity. Later the crocodile was killed and human remains found there too.

LUCKY ESCAPE: Mareeba croc attack survivor speaks out

MAREEBA father-of-two Marco Tiraboschi is still struggling to come to terms with what happened when he was attacked by a crocodile while fishing along the banks of a Far Northern river.

Talking exclusively to The Express, Marco counts himself lucky to be alive after a 4-4.5m croc dragged him into the water while he was fishing on the McIvor River.

He says he feels guilty about what happened and takes full responsibility for what he described as a careless act that could have been devastating for his family.

"Complacency and carelessness placed me too close to the water in such a high-risk location," he said.

"I had seen what was most probably the same croc in that location several years earlier. I'm disappointed with myself that I didn't remind myself of that at the time."

He said his actions on 3 November and, in hindsight on other previous occasions, were irresponsible.

"I have a young family and what they would have had to go through if I had not been so lucky, knowing that I was entirely at fault, upsets me the most," Marco said.

Clearly still traumatised by the event, Marco relayed what happened that day when the family took one of their regular camping trips to their property.

"Around 8.30am, before leaving camp, as we always do, Tammy and I went over our emergency action plan in the event of an incident and me not returning. I described in detail the route that I would take and approximate timings."

As a person who loves to take long bush walks and fish along the way on his own, Marco explained that he also always equips himself with his GPS, compass, EPIRB and basic first aid before taking off from the campsite.

After fishing at various locations along the river, he eventually arrived at a water hole he knew well and that had been good fishing in the past.

"I knew it had fish and I actually knew there was a croc there – I'd seen it there 2-3 years earlier," he said.

On this occasion, Marco saw a scrub bull there which should have been a red flag that a croc might be in the area and laying in wait for the bull.

"I saw a scrub bull leave that spot before I approached the water and failed to recognise the quite significant heightened risk to my safety," he said.

"I walked carelessly without thought of now an increased danger to within 1-2 metres of the water. I noticed almost immediately, three metres in front of me in the water, a movement towards me, and within seconds I recognised what it was.

"It was a head of a large croc and that's all I had time for – just to see it. It just, bang, came at me and only knocked me over initially.

"I kicked at it, as well struck it with my fishing rod for awhile. Eventually it got one foot. Kicking with my other leg, I managed to get it to release but shortly after, it got the other one (foot) and eventually it sort of pinned my legs and went to pull me in."

Marco then managed to grab a tree root or branch with his left hand as the croc attempted to pull him into deeper water. He then felt a significant muscle tear near his left shoulder.

"About a third of my pectoral came off the humus so I lost that grip and it took me in," he recounted.

Within about five seconds, Marco found himself being dragged into deep water.

He thought to himself: "Remain calm and not resist as to continue fighting might possibly cause the croc to spin."

Marco had the forethought to take a big breath before he was pulled under by the croc.

"Water clarity was good and I saw the croc's head and neck to my right.

"I purposely grabbed my hunting knife and just hit it as hard as I could just forward of the shoulder blade. A head shot would have done nothing (it's just bone), so I hit it forward of the shoulder and the knife sunk straight in," he said.

"It was like a 240-volt hit it, I felt it let go instantly and felt it take off."

Marco was in about 1.5m of water at the time but didn't panic, instead started to calmly breast stroke through the water until his boots could reach the ground.

"I felt the ground so then I walked up out of the water and onto land for a further six metres - at the time it felt enough, I had this inkling I got it by surprise," he said.

"It took approximately 15 seconds to move from the croc release to being safe on land.

This for me was my time of greatest fear as I felt that I may unbelievably survived this, only to still possibly be robbed of this gift if it came back at me."

After assessing his injuries and realising he was "structurally OK", Marco tied his boots tightly to provide some compression to the wounds. Thankfully, his boots were military standard and most likely saved his feet from being mangled by the jaws of the croc.

He then set off towards his vehicle, about 3km from the location, after which he drove back to the campsite and informed his wife, Tammy, that he needed medical assistance.

"I said to Tammy, 'I'm so sorry, we have to go to Cooktown, a croc got me. I'm cut and most likely need stitches'," he said. The couple and their two children set off for a 1.5 hour trip to the Cooktown Hospital where he was treated initially then flown to Cairns.

Marco considers himself to be extremely lucky to be alive and attributes the quality and strength of his boots and the fact that he had his six-inch hunting knife on his belt, as helping him to minimise his injuries and ultimately, making the difference between life and death.

"Any one thing could have made a difference – I had a lot of luck coming my way," he said.

"I have come to terms with the intensity and the closeness to death that I was. I have been told since that to survive an attack from a large croc, on your own, and to find yourself under water and come out of it is zero because no one ever has."

When asked whether he would be buying a Lotto ticket any time soon, Marco replied: "Surviving this, I don't need to buy a lotto ticket, I've won the lotto.

"I fought like my life depended on it and it did. I don't want to give myself credit for that, because how can I take credit for that when I put myself in that danger."

He says complacency so nearly could have cost him his life. "I didn't think, I was careless. It's that familiarity – you've been there before and nothing happened. Here's the wrong attitude I've taken - that is what's the chance of a croc being there ready to strike? Well guess what, it happened."

Marco says he will completely change his approach when he returns to the area to fish in the future.

"From now on, I will approach any waterway which even has a small chance of a croc in it with the assumption that the croc is not only there, but also right in front of you, ready to strike."

Queensland Ambulance Service Northwest District Superintendant Brad Hardy said there was a large population of freshwater crocodiles in the area.

"They are normally quite timid but when they are surprised they will be aggressive," he said.
